How many have had the opportunity to take a Guild workshop for only \$5 for the weekend?


How many were able to take the bus to Paducah?

Only brand news members were left standing!

What made all of this possible? Money we made hosting Quilt Shows. Last year the quilt show committee gave Stitchers Treasurer a check for \$10,000. If you have looked at the proposed budget you see that they are planning the year with an income from the show same as last year.

- Entries 124 we need at least 200+ to make it a nice show. If no one is interested in displaying their quilts or working – maybe the Guild needs to rethink hosing a show. Every year we have to beg for quilts. I have gone back over pics from Show and Tell and there are lots of quilts that could be entered. If we don't receive enough entries by 13 August (deadline to enter) – we will look at other options to fill the rooms. Maybe a display of Hosparus quilts = one member asked to be a featured quilter – we will fill the rooms with something. The 13th will be the deadline. It's not like this is a surprise. We have had the entry forms available for months. *(This date has now passed.)*
- 2. Volunteers as of now 45 members out of 124 members have signed up for some slot to work. That is 36% of our membership. Again does the Guild want to continue sponsorship of the Quilt Show? Why are members not signing up? Can anyone answer that question? There are lots of positions that do not require any physical work just sitting.
- a. Café several slots open
- b. Country Store setup tons of items to put out. This is usually our biggest money -making area.
- c. Saturday back door admission no one has signed up
- d. Several members (especially those on the Quilt Show Committee) will be at the show the majority of the weekend and will fill in as needed. We have all worked hard the past months getting things together/organized for the show but will definitely be there to help out.
- e. Opportunity Quilt tickets need to be sold. Suzanne Davis has several envelopes not picked up yet. There are 25 tickets in the envelope. Everyone should be able to sell at least 25 tickets.
- f. Bed Turning we need quilts for Anne Aubrey to be able to do the Bed Turning for the Show, please talk with her about entering your quilt.

Minutes of Club Meeting – Stitchers Quilt Guild Date of Meeting – July, 2023 Place: Hardin County Cooperative Extension Office Time of Meeting: 6:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by President Barbara Dixon. She welcomed everyone to the meeting and 3 new members: Barbara Farmer, Tracy Knutson and Pamela Patterson.

Approval of Minutes – The minutes of the June meeting were previously emailed out. Elieen Robbins moved to approve the minutes as presented and Kathy Mitchell seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report – The June Treasurer's Report was emailed to club members earlier. There was no discussion and the report will be filed for audit.

Quilt Show- Amy Labriola thanked and recognized all members that helped at the Hardin County Fair with quilts. Our quilt won Best of Show. The \$50 check was presented to the Guild. Patty Pruitt, Quilt Show Chairperson –

She had everyone stand up and if you did or received one of the following sit down – How many have received a door prize here at the Guild meeting? How many have had the opportunity to take a Guild workshop for only \$5 for the weekend? How many were able to take the bus to Paducah? 
