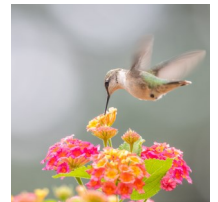
Letter From The President

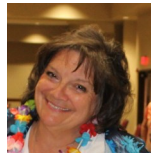

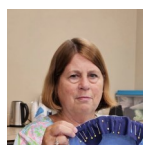

Set Up Poles—Saturday 6 July (9-12) - This requires climbing a ladder and forming the frames for the quilts to be hung. We will need 3-4 ladder that are 6 foot tall and 4 that are willing and able to climb ladders and 4 to help hold the poles.

Quilt Entries—Entries will be taken on Sunday afternoon and Monday morning. Would be nice to have about 6 people to help put hangers and hang quilts. Will require some ladder climbing.

Tuesday Morning—Quilts are judged. Will need 2 assistants to help tag and hang ribbons.

Monday—Saturday—The Fair is open from 4:00 to 10:00. The Midway doesn't open until 6:00. We will need 2 people to watch the quilts and to sell opportunity quilt tickets for the guild. We will have time slots every 2 hours.

Sunday- Quilt Entries are taken down and signed out to those who entered. Will need 6-8 to assist.
